

Consent:

I have received the Vaccine Information Statement(s) and the content was explained to me before vaccine administration. I understand that if this vaccine requires two doses, two doses of this vaccine will need to be administered in order for it to be effective. I have had a chance to ask questions which were answered to my satisfaction and I understand the benefits and risks of the vaccination(s). I request that the vaccination(s) be given to me (or the person named above for whom I am authorized to make this request). SpartanNash may use and disclose my personal and health information for treatment, to receive payment for the care provided, and for other health care operations. Health care operations generally include those activities performed to improve the quality of care. I acknowledge that I received a detailed copy of the NOTICE OF PRIVACY AND CONFIDENTIAL PRACTICES to help me better understand SpartanNash policies in regards the use of my personal health information. I agree to remain in the general area for at least 15-30 minutes after being vaccinated. I certify that information given by me in applying for payment under Title XVIII of the Social Security Act is correct. I request that payment of authorized Medicare/Medicaid or other private insurance benefits be made on my behalf to SpartanNash. I authorize SpartanNash to bill my insurance carrier directly for services provided on my behalf. I authorize payment for any services provided to me SpartanNash to be paid directly to SpartanNash. All references to SpartanNash within this consent include activities conducted at their corporately owned retail locations including, but not limited to: Family Fare, Vg's Grocery, Forest Hills Foods, D&W Fresh Markets, Martin's Super Markets, Family Fresh Markets, and Econofoods.

The FDA has made the COVID-19 vaccine available under an emergency use authorization (EUA). The EUA is used when circumstances exist to justify the emergency use of drugs and biologic products during an emergency, such as the COVID-19 pandemic. This vaccine has not completed the same type of review as an FDA-approved or cleared product. However, the FDA's decision to make the vaccine available under an EUA is based on the existence of a public health emergency and the totality of scientific evidence available, showing that known and potential benefits of the vaccine outweigh the known and potential risks.
